Payments and Deposit

Deposit of \$100 per person or a minimum of \$500/cabin required at time of booking.

Deposit can be made by Visa, Mastercard, e-transfer or cash. Sorry, no personal cheques.

Deposits are non-refundable.

Safety and Emergency

- If you are new to the lake, tell someone what your plans are before heading out on the water. If you are late returning, we know where to find you.
- In case of emergency please have someone from your group immediately ring the emergency bell located on the back porch of the main lodge.
- First aid supplies are available for minor injuries.
- Fire extinguishers are located on the wall in kitchen area of each cabin, and on main docks.
- Beer on the Peer, Water on the Water.
- Boaters card is required for kids 16 and older to operate our rental boats. Under 16, with Mom or Dad only.
- Always leave a contact number with family. Each year we receive calls from frantic family members trying to locate loved ones.
- If you are out on the lake and hear thunder, please come back to camp as soon as possible. If you get caught in the storm and are unable to get to camp then try to reach the shore and stay there.

Cabin Rules

- Please do no smoke inside cabin. Cigarettes butts should be disposed in a safe manner. Not, on the ground where a chance of fire could occur.
- Your cabin has been thoroughly cleaned, please leave it clean.
- Quiet time between 10pm-7am.
- Fish cleaning in fish house only.
- Please keep garbage and recycling separate.
- Place garbage outside for pick up.
- Place beer bottles back into cases and take them home with you.
- Dispose of cooking oil only after it has cooled. Containers are located beside Fish House.
- **Never, ever pour water on a grease fire! It will explode!**
- Our electricity is solar power. Please turn off all lights when not in use and do not plug anything in. If the battery bank becomes drained, we will have no water and no refrigeration. Radios are permitted but please no electric appliances. Battery powdered fans only.
- Barbecues and fish fryers are to be used outside. Not on porch!

Kitchens

- Your kitchen is well equipped with the necessary tools. If you are missing something, please let us know. We can get that for you.
- Cook stove is propane. The burners and ovens operate on pilots. To turn on burners push in knob before turning. If you are having difficulty, please see us.
- Please do not store flats of worms in fridge. They do escape and make a HUGE mess. Coolers are available if needed.
- Ants and rodents just love a nice free buffet. If you leave food out, they will find it.
- Please help us reduce waste by composting vegetable peelings, eggshells, coffee grounds and any fruits or vegetables.
- Food waste containing meat, cheese, fish, poultry, or bones can be disposed of in the fish house.
- Cooking oil can be disposed of in designated containers once cooled.
- Propane grills are to be used outside only. Please turn off tank after each use.
- Please do not use duct tape on any surface. It is almost impossible to remove the glue and does damage to finishes.

Bathrooms

We have provided the following amenities for your stay,

- Toilet paper
- Shampoo, Conditioner and Bar soap
- Shower mat

Please note: Due to our remote location, unlimited internet is not available. Therefore, we ask that you limit your usage and refrain from streaming!

Docking

- Docks will be designated for each rental as well as private boats. Please do not park in someone else slip.
- Gas is provided for rental boats only. If you need gas for your personal boat, please see a member of our staff.
- For safety reasons we ask that you slow down when nearing docks, boats, swimmers, and water toys.

Rental Boats

- Our fishing maps show fishing spots as well as shallow waters and shoals. Please, stay well away from shallow water. If you accidentally hit the motor, please let us know immediately.
- Your rental boat has been cleaned and fueled.
- Please keep it clean. That means, no garbage, dead bait, beer cans or cigarette butts.
- If you get fishing line caught in the prop, let us know. It is an easy fix and can prevent serious damage.
- Please do not tinker or adjust motors. If you are having issues with your boat or motor, please see a staff member.
- If you get your anchor caught on bottom, do not cut the rope. Tie the rope to the float inside the safety kit and make note of your location. Wayne will retrieve it. Never go out on the water without an anchor.

Water Toys

Canoes, kayaks, paddle boards are available at no charge. If you use them, please return them to the designated area. Lifejackets should be worn!

Lake Water

Lake water is suitable for cooking and consuming only if it has been boiled. We recommend bringing bottled water for drinking.

Pets

We know how much you love your cute cuddly and adorable pet. They are family and you want to bring them with you wherever you go. Due to our strict cleaning policies and allergies, we cannot allow any pets of any size.

Fish Cleaning

Fish cleaning is to be done in fish cleaning house only. Please put entrails in pails, rinse counter and turn off lights. No garbage in buckets. The gulls, eagles and vultures will thank you for that.

Fishing regulations as well as methods for transport are posted in the fishing cleaning house as well as each cabin.

Fishing Regulations

Lake Kipawa has an outstanding fishery. Fishing regulations regarding sizes and limits are put into place to keep it that way. Please follow all rules. The wardens are on the lake and will be checking!

Fish	Limit per licence	Size
Walleye	6	Between 37cm-53cm
Lake trout	1	Min 65cm
Northern Pike	6	No size limit
Bass	6	No size limit

Please note:

- Minnows are not permitted, dead or alive.
- Only fish with 1 fishing rod per person
- No bait can be imported into Canada

Fishing Logs

At the end of each season, we are required by law to submit an “Activities Report”, to the Quebec government. This report must include species, fish caught, fish consumed, and fish transported home as well as guest numbers. Please take time each day to record your catch on the supplied fish log. This will help us to be as accurate as possible.
